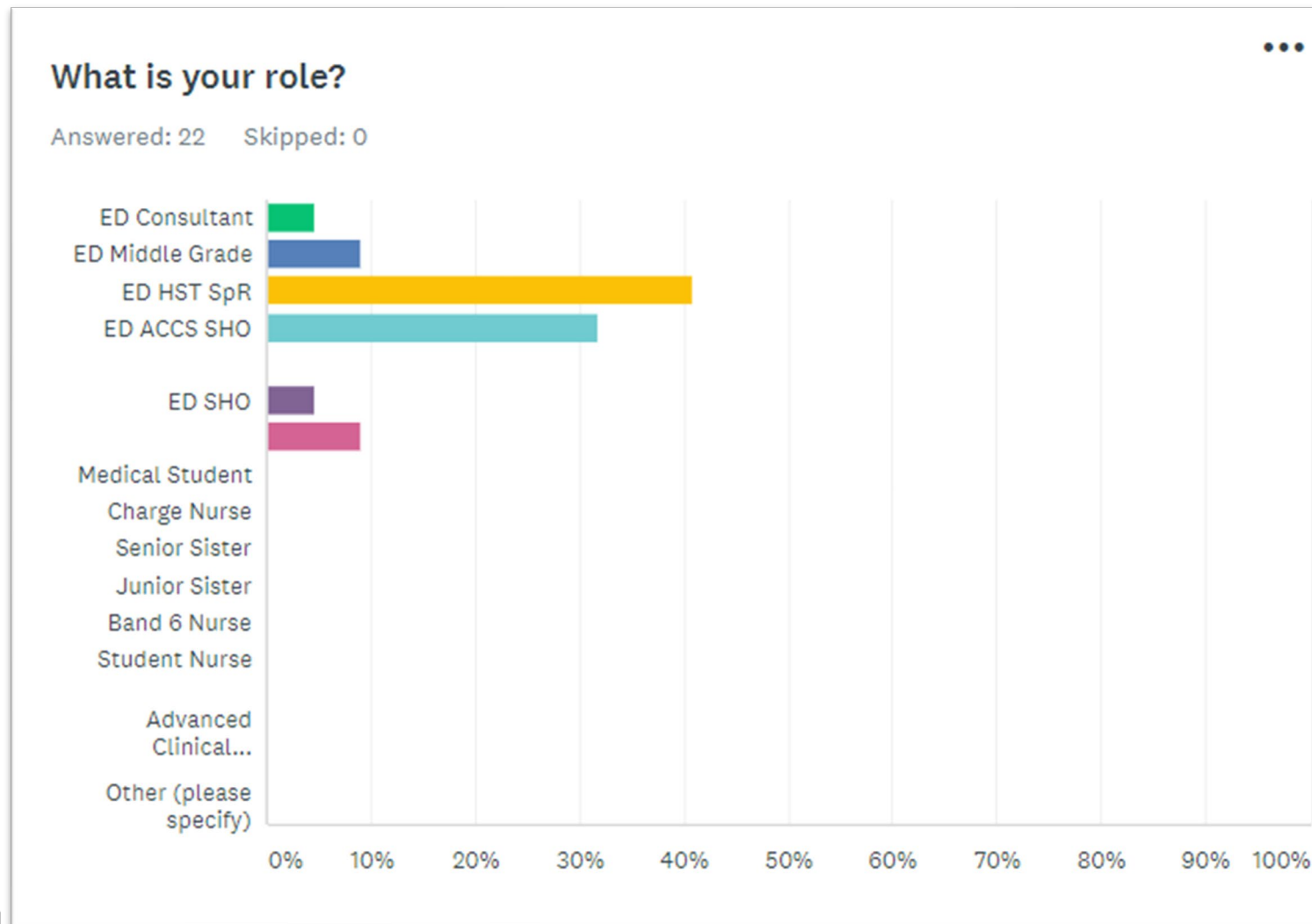

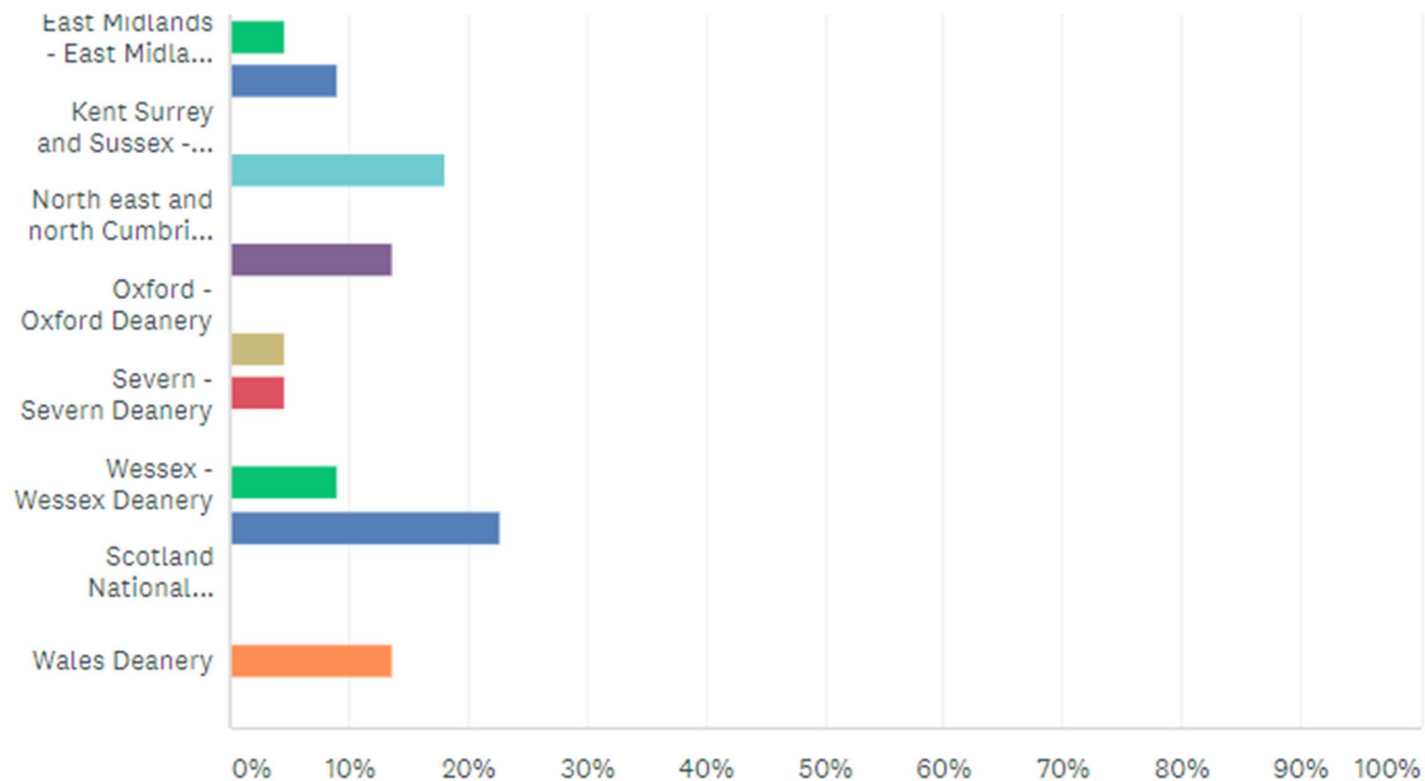

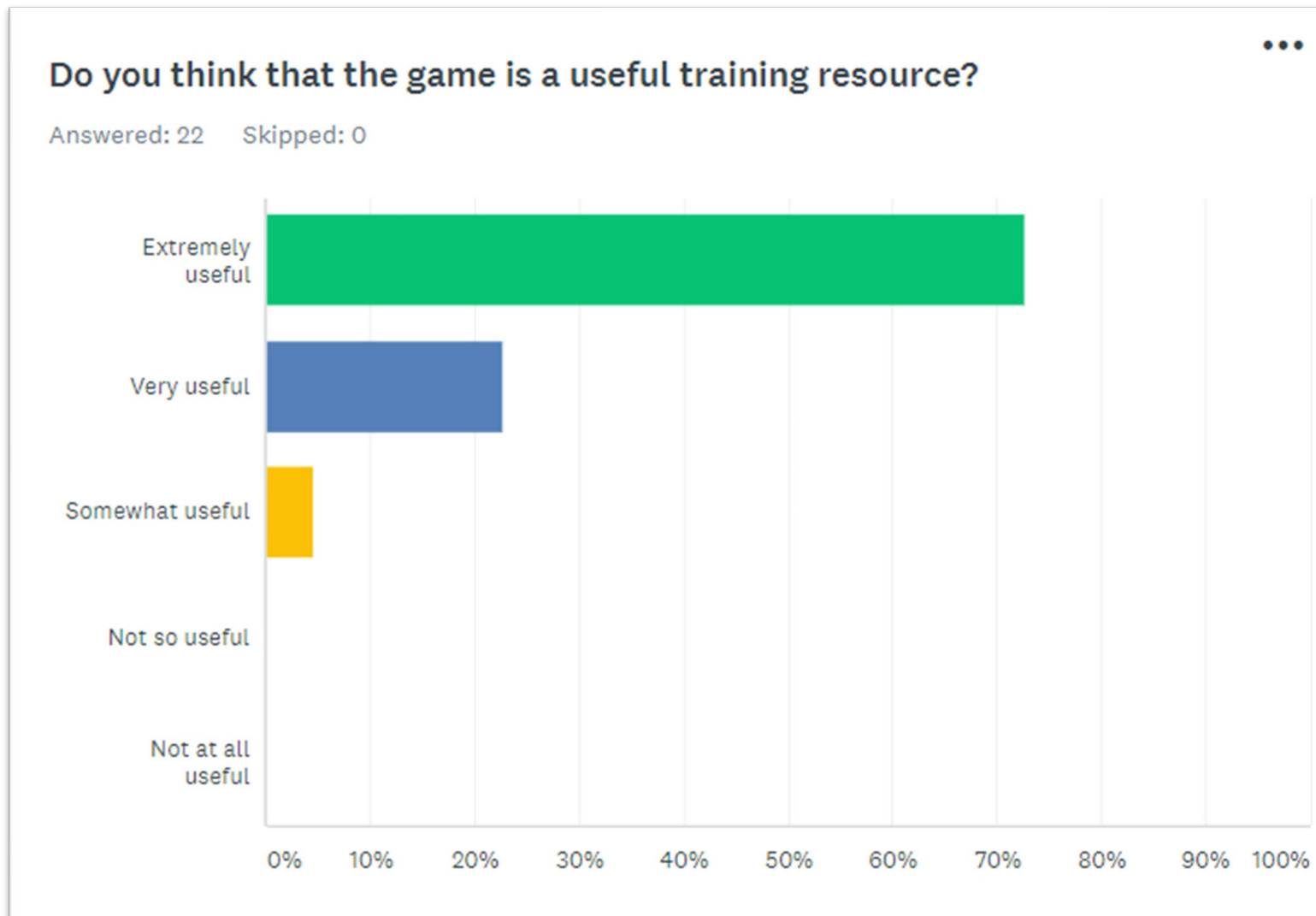




### Which Deanery do you belong to?

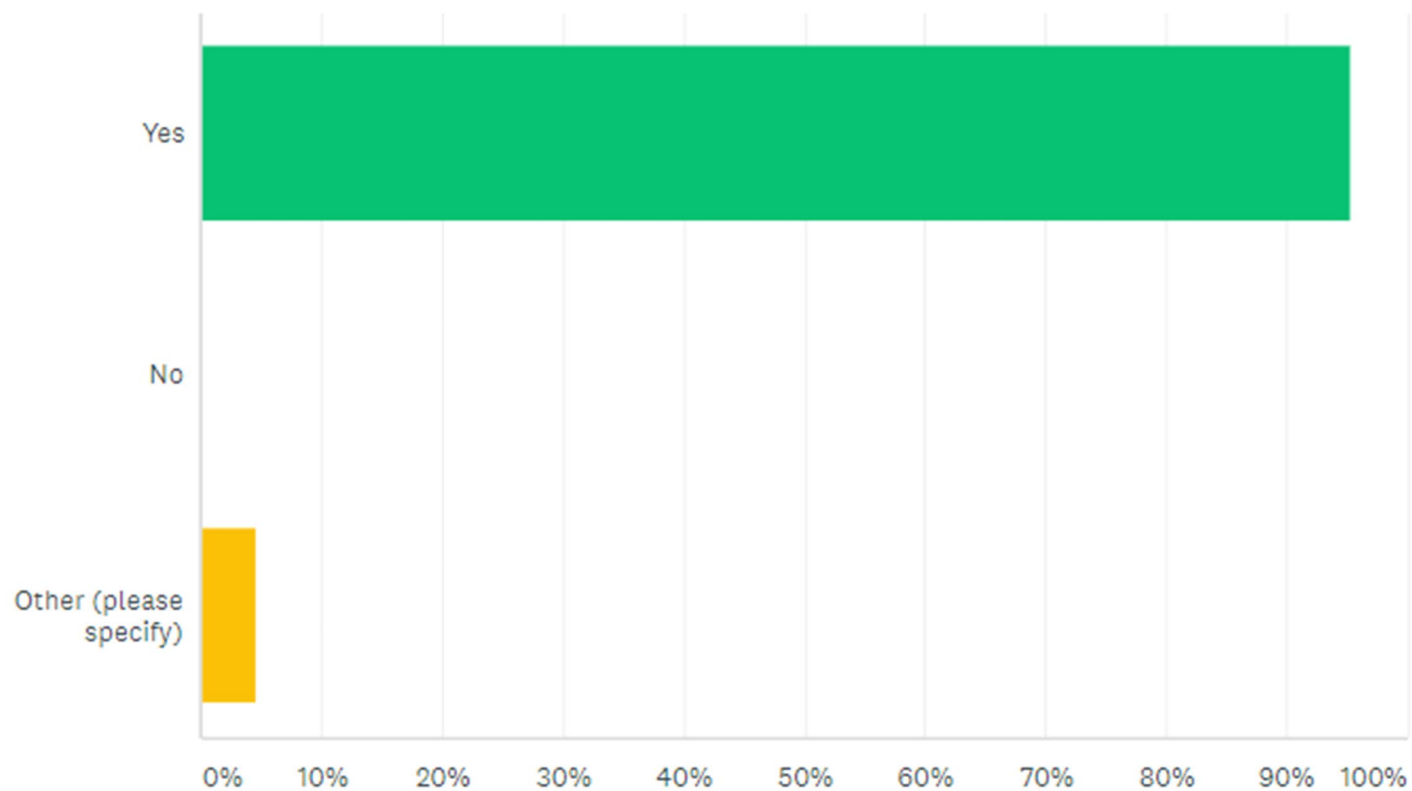

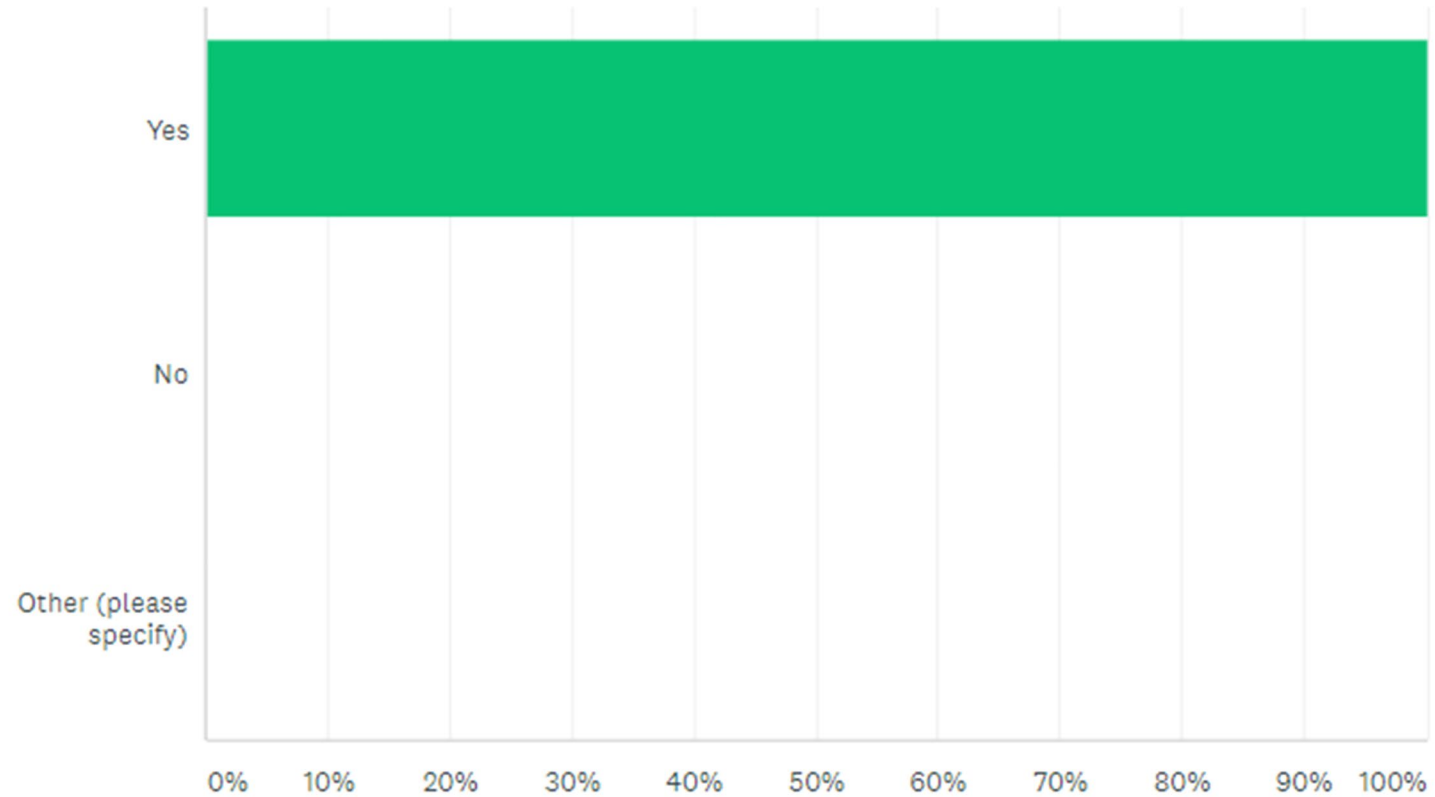

### Was the game enjoyable?

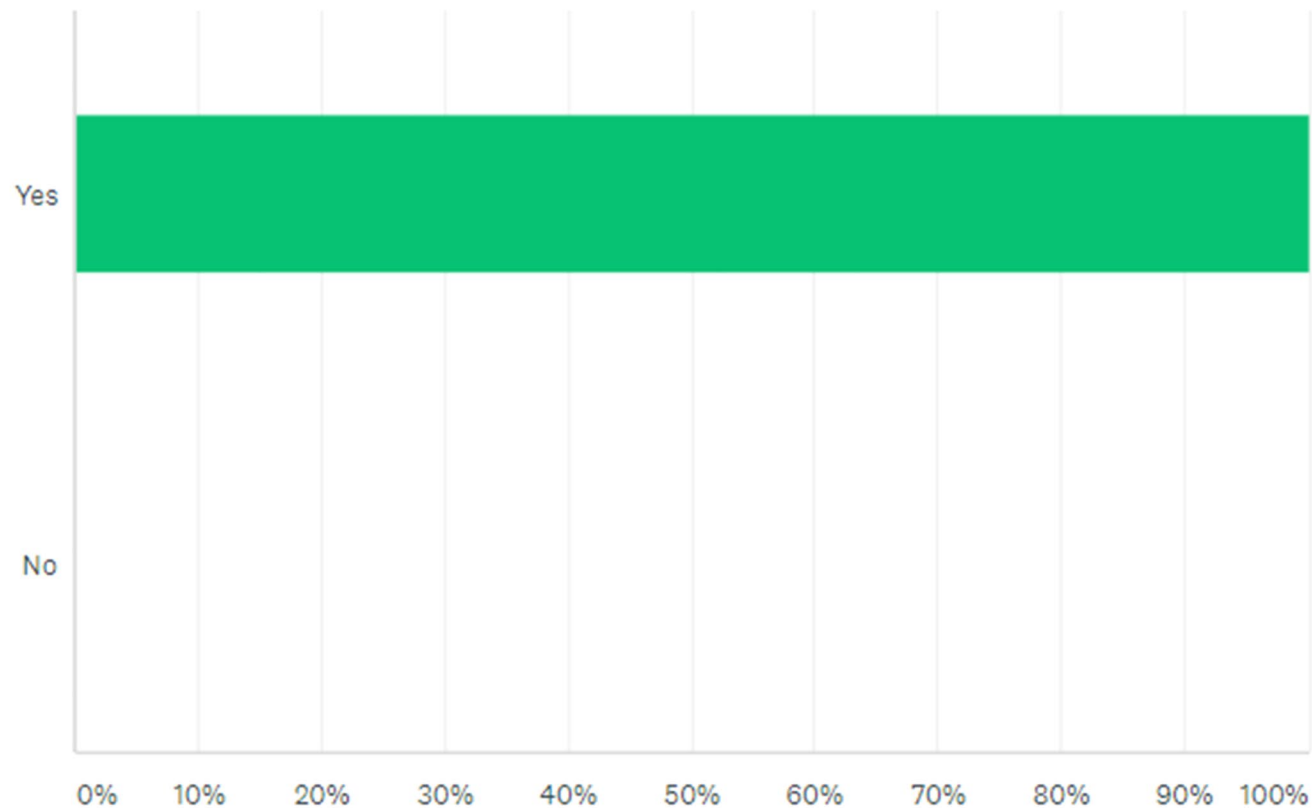
